Application for Permission to study a VCE Units 3-4



Due in: By 8.30 am Monday 31 July 2017 with appropriate documentation to Senior School Curriculum Office (B204)

Decisions will be based on whether students have performed at a consistently high level, relative to other students, in all subjects, NAPLAN and other testing which may be available.

It is not in a student's best interest to study one advanced subject unless they are able to perform to a high standard in that, and all their other subjects. As a guide, students need to achieve results which place them in the top 20% of students in each measure.

Who needs to fill out this form?

Students who have successfully studied a subject at Unit 1 / 2 Level in 2017 can proceed with their studies at Unit 3-4 level **WITHOUT** an application.

Other students may apply to study one VCE Unit 3-4 subject but only if the necessary 'Application Form' has been completed and approved. The VCE Unit 3-4 subjects that are available are listed with the 'Application Form'.

Why make an application?

A Study Score of 41 or above in certain Unit 3-4 sequences and strong results in other subjects may qualify a student for a University Extension subject in a related subject area in Year 12.

Year 11 presents you with the possibility of choosing a Unit 3-4 sequence that will count towards your final ATAR score (you can count up to six Unit 3-4 sequences for tertiary entrance purposes).

This pathway is not in the best interests of most students so it is important for you to talk to people and seek advice so that the decisions you make are as well informed as they can be.

A study score of 40 contributes the same increment to an ATAR as one extra point in each of your 'primary four' Year 12 subjects. Across Victoria 9% of results in each subject will be 40 or above.

Only one acceleration subject will be approved for students.

What you need to do:

- 1. Check to see if you meet the following criteria (if you don't you should not be completing this application):
 - results across all areas of an 'A' standard
 - an ability to demonstrate that you are well organised and motivated to succeed
 - an acknowledgement that the 'academic pace' will be set at Year 12 level
- 2. If you meet these criteria you then need to complete the form overleaf
- 3. Deliver your application (together with supporting documentation) to Senior School Curriculum Office (B204) by 8.30 am Monday 31 July 2017.
- 4. You must also complete the Subject Selection Planning Sheet attached.

What happens once your application is lodged?

- 1. Your application will be considered at a meeting attended by the Senior School Curriculum Co-ordinators. The relevant Leader of Learning, your Mentor and your current teachers may also be asked for feedback on your performance and suitability for acceleration. You may also be required to undertake a task or attend an interview to gauge your suitability.
- 2. You will be advised whether your application has been successful after the due date for submission of your Subject Selection Form (Thursday 3 August).
